RE: Planning group request for traffic calming recommendations along Laurelridge Road
and Ofria Avenue.

The December 16, 2013 meeting of the Navajo Community Planning Group included a discussion of traffic safety along Laurelridge Road and Ofria Avenue. The discussion centered on a request from neighbors living along the corridor to change the intersection to an all-way stop as a means to curb vehicle speeding. The planning group also heard from residents opposed to the request citing driveway ingress and egress impacts if the change were to occur.

Planning Group members expressed numerous suggestions to address community concerns including the elimination of the dual yellow stripe, installation of speed bumps, the use of electronic speed indicators, Botts dots, as well as the installation of an all-way stop. In the absence of a traffic engineer expert, the planning group was not comfortable making a formal recommendation and officially seeks the input from city traffic safety experts.

The Navajo Community Planning Group - by unanimous vote - respectfully requests that the city's traffic engineers provide us with their specific recommendations to best remedy the traffic concerns raised by community members prior to our next meeting scheduled for Monday, January 27, 2014.

Your favorable and timely response to our request is greatly appreciated.
